

PARENT PAYMENT ARRAGEMENTS POLICY

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Keilor Views Primary School is looking forward to another great year of teaching and learning and would like to advise you of Keilor Views Primary School's voluntary financial contributions for 2023. Schools provide students with free instruction to fulfil the standard curriculum requirements and we want to assure you that all contributions are voluntary.

The school is committed to creating a positive, connected school community and implementing good practices form part of this commitment, while aiming to provide the best educational opportunities and outcomes for students both inside and outside the classroom.

To assist this practice the Department of Education and Training provides free instruction in the standard curriculum program to all students in government schools. Free instruction is the teaching staff, administration and the provision of facilities in connection with the instruction of the standard curriculum program, including reasonable adjustments for students with disabilities.

However, the school can ask parents for payments for items, activities and services under three categories, (a) curriculum contributions, (b) extra-curricular items and activities or (c) other contributions.

(a) Curriculum Contributions

These are items, activities or services that the school deems essential to student learning in the standard curriculum.

- Items that the student takes temporary or permanent possession of such as textbooks, student stationery, book bags, etc.
- Materials for learning and technology where the student consumes or takes possession of the finished articles (e.g. technology projects, workbooks, etc.).
- Activities associated with instruction that all students are expected to attend, such as costs associated with excursions, incursions, school sports, travel, entry fees, etc.

(b) Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

These are items or services that are **optional** and are offered in addition to the standard curriculum. Students may access these on a user pays basis. These items include:

- Activities the student purchases (e.g. fees for extra-curricular programs or activities offered in addition to the standard curriculum such as instrumental music tuition; fees for guest speakers; optional camps and excursions; entry fees to school-based performances, productions and events).
- Items the student purchases or hires (e.g. school magazines; class photos; formals/graduation functions; materials for extracurricular activities; etc.).
- Items and materials that are more expensive than required to meet the standard curriculum.

(c) Other Contributions.

Keilor Views Primary School ceased inviting Voluntary Contributions in 2014.

Regarding parent payments, this includes consideration of how parent payments are set, clearly communicating how decisions are made and recognizing that some families experiencing hardship may need additional consideration and support.

In setting parent payments based on the school curriculum, the principal and school council are responsible for approving parent payments and will determine how items, activities and services are classified within these categories based on the learning and teaching program of their school.

The School Council is very mindful of the financial commitment for families in today's environment, but will always ensure that school fees and costs are set at realistic levels to safeguard for the continual rising costs of transport, excursions, incursions, activities, etc.

The School Council has met and set the Parent Payment Structure for 2023.

FREE INSTRUCTION

- Schools provide students with free instruction and ensure students have free access to all items, activities and services that are used by the school to fulfil the requirements of the Curriculum. This includes the Victorian Curriculum F-10, the Victorian Certificate of Education (VCE) including the VCE Vocational Major and the Victorian Pathways Certificate.
- Schools may invite parents to make a financial contribution to support the school.

PARENT PAYMENT REQUESTS

Schools can request contributions from parents under three categories:



Curriculum Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for curriculum items and activities which the school deems necessary for students to learn the Curriculum.

Other Contributions

Voluntary financial contributions for non-curriculum items and activities that relate to the school's functions and objectives.

Extra-Curricular Items and Activities

Items and activities that enhance or broaden the schooling experience of students and are above and beyond what the school provides for free to deliver the Curriculum. These are provided on a user-pays basis.

• Schools may also invite parents to supply or purchase educational items to use and own (e.g. textbooks, stationery, digital devices).



FINANCIAL HELP FOR FAMILIES

- Schools put in place financial hardship arrangements to support families who cannot pay for items or activities so that their child doesn't miss out.
- Schools have a nominated parent payment contact person(s) that parents can have a confidential discussion with regarding financial hardship arrangements.



SCHOOL PROCESSES

Schools must obtain school council approval for their parent payment arrangements and publish all requests and communications for each year level on their school website for transparency.
